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why are even progressive local authorities with the will to improve seldom able to change cities why does it seem almost impossible to redress spatial inequalities deliver and maintain basic services elevate impoverished areas and protect the

marginalised communities why do municipalities in the global south refuse to work with prevailing social informalities and resort instead to interventions that are known to displace and aggravate the very issues they aim to address local officials and the struggle to transform cities analyses these challenges in south african cities where the brief post apartheid moment opened a window for progressive city government and made research into state practices both possible and necessary in debate with other progressive moments in large cities in brazil the usa and india the book interrogates city officials practices it considers the instruments they invent and negotiate to implement urban policies the agency they develop and the constraints they navigate in governing unequal cities this focus on actual officials practices is captured through first hand experience state ethnographies and engaged research these reveal day to day practice that question generalised explanations of state failure in complex urban societies as essential malevolence contextual weakness corruption and inefficiency it is hoped that opening the black box of the workings of state opens paths for the construction of progressive policies in contemporary cities

effective and efficient benefit sharing tourism can positively impact numerous stakeholders within and beyond the protected area living on the edge benefit sharing from protected area tourism highlights the complexity of benefit sharing the importance of identifying all relevant stakeholders the challenges of ensuring equity and sustainability and the critical importance of good governance the evolution of benefit sharing mechanisms over time also emphasizes a continuing need to evolve and adapt to each unique situation as much evidence indicates that little has changed for those living on the edge although this book focuses on benefit sharing from protected area tourism it is essential to acknowledge that along with these benefits are costs associated with tourism including possible increased local prices loss of access to land human wildlife conflict and other related costs the contributing authors agree that benefit sharing must include good governance accountability equity transparency a broad reach of stakeholder engagement and a robust combination of tangible and intangible benefits with recognition that benefit sharing systems need to be adaptive and evolve as needed according to the relevant situation the chapters in this book were originally published as a special issue of the journal of sustainable tourism

the main purpose of this book is to provide a concise overview of educational transition to document discuss and analyse key changes and continuities in south african education since the end of apartheid what makes this period particularly fascinating for educationalists is that the legacy of apartheid and the years of international isolation meant that educational reform had to be fundamental and wide ranging if south africa was to become a modern democratic state participating in the global political economy of the twenty first century the result was that in the final five years of the twentieth century south africa became something of a laboratory or crucible for educational innovation from 1948 to the early 1990s south african government was based on an institutionalised system of racial separation and inequality formally known as apartheid a white minority dominated a black majority in a context of stark social political and economic differentiation while the apartheid state used force to maintain this system formal education was also used to try to make the basic tenets of apartheid normal and acceptable in the minds of south africans from the apartheid government s point of view the role of education was to help to perpetuate and reproduce a racist system and to encourage obedience and conformity to that system it is not therefore surprising that in the 1970s and 1980s education also became a key site in the struggle against apartheid or that educational reform was high on the agenda of the first democratically elected government after april 1994 however while the direction of educational reform has inevitably been strongly influenced by the nature and history of the anti apartheid

struggle inside south africa the global political and economic context has also played its part in shaping educational debate and policy outside south africa clive harber s book recognises that there is a difference between planned reform and the actual nature of educational change on the ground and tries where possible to set reform in the contextual realities of south african education as they presently exist it aims to understand the difficulties and ambiguities of transition as well as the overt aims and goals as enshrined in policy documents and legislation

in this ground breaking study sabine binder analyses the complex ways in which female crime fictional victims detectives and perpetrators in south african crime fiction resonate with widespread and persistent real crimes against women in post apartheid south africa drawing on a wide range of crime novels written over the last decade binder emphasises the genre s feminist potential and critically maps its political work at the intersection of gender and race her study challenges the perception of crime fiction as a trivial genre and shows how in south africa at least it provides a vibrant platform for social cultural and ethical debates exposing violence misogyny and racism and shedding light on the problematics of law and justice for women faced with crime
